Katie Bartosik Distinguished Cardinal Award Winner

In honor of distinguished and exceptional service to the Upper Dublin Athletic Program, this award recognizes significant contributions and commitment to the success of Upper Dublin High School Athletics.



This year's recipient of the Distinguished Cardinal Award is our Athletic Trainer, Ms. Katie Bartosik. Katie earned her bachelor's degree in 2002 from Cabrini University and then her master's degree in 2004 from Temple University. In 2005, she became the Athletic Trainer at Upper Dublin High School. Since that time Katie Bartosik, affectionally known as "Trainer B," has been a staple on the fields and around the UD community. Year after year she dedicates countless hours to help keep our student-athletes healthy and safe so that they can perform their best to represent our school. Not only does she take care of our student-athletes, she is one of the number one supporters of our athletic programs. Her ability to relate to kids is uncanny and she earns the respect of the athletes and their families for what she gives back to them. In addition, you can hear Trainer B sing the National Anthem at many of our sporting events, earning high praises from visiting players, coaches, officials, and spectators. Trainer B is also an Assistant Adjunct Professor at Temple University in the College of Public Health. She is a First Aid and CPR instructor with the American Red Cross. She is also a Platelet Donor and Transportation specialist delivering blood to hospitals in the Tri-State area. She enjoys reading and watching movies in her free time and enjoys "Old Movie Classics." She likes to exercise, play golf, and has recently dabbled in pickleball. She also likes to go to

Broadway to attend shows. She enjoys her summer months in Wildwood Crest, NJ with her family.

#### Paul McNutt Class of 1973

Wrestling was growing in popularity in the 70's not only here at Upper Dublin but across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Throughout Paul's illustrious career, he racked up 54 career wins and a .782 winning percentage. In the regular season of his senior season, he finished with a .875 winning percentage.



At that time, there were no classifications in high school wrestling nor what is now known as "wrestle backs." Only the top two wrestlers advanced and one loss could end a successful season quickly. Paul was a sectional champion in 1972 and came back his senior year to not only win sectionals but was named Most Outstanding Wrestler. He went on to be the District I champion and was the Regional runner-up, falling to Tom Mulak of Upper Dauphin. At the PIAA State Championships, Paul opened with a fall over a Greenville wrestler, before falling to Glenn Hall 5-3 in the semi-finals. Hall went on to be the state champion. Paul rebounded by defeating George Way 6-4 to place 3<sup>rd</sup>, earning him a state medal. This was the first state medal in wrestling in Upper Dublin High School history.

After Upper Dublin, Paul went on to North Carolina State University. While there he was a 2x ACC Champion and a 2x NCAA Qualifier. After college, he became a teacher in the Lower Moreland Township School District, where he also coached wrestling.

He married his high school sweetheart, Kathleen Brick, and they had two children, Dylan and Connor. The McNutt family eventually moved to Maui for seven years before deciding to relocate to Southern California, where they currently reside. Paul owns his own business and enjoys hiking and backpacking.

#### 2018 Girls' Basketball Team PIAA State Champions

2018 was the 3rd year that the PIAA went to six classifications. The

Flying Cardinals finished the regular season with an impressive 18-4 record, which gave them the 9<sup>th</sup> seed in the District I playoffs.



Once districts began, the top 11 seeds would qualify for the PIAA state tournament. In the first round, the girls routed Pennsbury 54-24. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> round, the team was on the losing end of a 37-34 decision to Council Rock North. That would be the team's final loss of the year. In district playbacks, the team defeated Haverford, Central Bucks East, and Perkiomen Valley to earn the 9<sup>th</sup> seed from District I entering the PIAA state tournament.

The first round of states pitted the Flying Cardinals against Philadelphia Catholic League power Cardinal O'Hara. UD found a way to win 42-35. They toppled Garnet Valley in round 2 by a score of 39-29. The quarterfinals set up a showdown with league rival Abington and UD came out with a 36-31 win. The semi-finals were against the District I champion, Souderton. In a defensive battle, the girls pulled out a 26-25 win to set up a state-final matchup in Hershey facing Central Bucks South. In another classic defensive battle, UD made enough plays to earn a 41-39 victory, sealing the school's first PIAA State title in girls' basketball. The team finished 27-5 overall while on an eight-game winning streak.

The team was coached by Morgan Funsten, Monica Newman, Shira Newman, and Tony Funsten. They were captained by Nicole Kaiser and Maggie Weglos. The Lady Cards had 5 Suburban One All-League selections in Kaiser, Jackie Vargas, Weglos, Dayna Balasa, and Jess Polin. Vargas was named to the 1<sup>st</sup> team All-State team with Polin named the *Philadelphia Inquirer* Freshman of the Year.

#### Nicole Catanzaro Hughes Class of 1996

Nicole was a three-sport athlete when she walked the halls of Upper Dublin, competing in Field Hockey, Basketball, and Soccer. On the field hockey field, she thrived.

Nicole was a 2-time Suburban One League selection and a 2-time All-Area selection in field hockey. She was a stalwart on the defensive side of the field and played a major contribution in the 1994 season, where the "Cinderella Team" placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in districts. That team posted nine shut-outs and completed the most successful season in UD history with a 16-5-2 record. The following year she helped lead the team to a division title. She was named as the captain and the team MVP with six goals and 18 assists in her senior season. Her stellar play led Nicole to receive a scholarship to Michigan State University, where she would continue her field hockey career.

At Michigan State University, Nicole was a four-year starter and was named the MSU Rookie of the Year. She was a 3x All-Big Ten Academic Honoree. She was named to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) D-1 National Academic Squad. She also was the recipient of the Shirley Cook Endowment Award in her senior year.

After earning her bachelor's degree in Education from MSU, she earned a master's degree in English from Salisbury University. She is currently completing her Teaching Writing Graduate Certificate at Johns Hopkins University. Nicole works as an AVID Elective teacher for the Cape Henlopen School District.

In 2001, Nicole began coaching field hockey at North Caroline High in Denton, MD. She moved on to coaching the Mariner Middle School program for two years. She eventually took over the varsity program at Cape Henlopen HS from 2007-2012 during which time she led the team to many conference titles. In her final year of coaching, she led the team to the DE State Championship. Nicole is married to Michael Hughes and they have two children, Adelia and Anthony. As a running enthusiast she has completed three marathons and multiple half marathons. She also enjoys going to the beach with her family and friends.

#### Bob Bantley Class of 2013

Upper Dublin High School has a long list of sensational swimmers. Near the top of that list is Bob Bantley. Bob was a 4-year letter winner and a member of four Suburban One League Team Championships. He was a 15x Suburban One All-League Selection. Upon his graduation, he held six UDHS pool records. Of those, three



were in individual events (50, 100, and 200 freestyle), and three of those as part of a relay (200 Medley, 200, and 400 freestyle).

Bob was a 4-year District I qualifier as well as a 4-year PIAA State qualifier. In his senior season, he was named the 2013 District I Most Outstanding Male swimmer by earning two individual gold medals and two relay gold medals. He carried that onto the state championship meet a few weeks later, where he earned two individual gold medals, two relay gold medals and once again was named the Most Outstanding Male Swimmer. Bob was the first UD swimmer to earn that award at the AAA state championships. In his senior season, despite only playing one sport, he was named the school's Most Outstanding Male Athlete.

After Upper Dublin, Bob went on to a successful swimming career at Penn State University. He earned four varsity letters as a Nittany Lion. He was a team captain in his junior and senior years and earned the Captain's Award as a senior. Bob set a school record in the 800 Freestyle Relay, which still stands. He was a 7x Big Ten Podium finisher at the end of his career. Bob earned his degree in Economics in 2017. He is currently a Senior Financial Analyst. He enjoys reading, spending time with family and friends, fitness, and food.

#### Kelly Yemm Class of 2003

Kelly was a sensational athlete in both field hockey and lacrosse while in high school at Upper Dublin. In the fall while playing field hockey she earned three varsity letters. She earned All-League honors in all three of those seasons, including the first team in her senior year. In her junior year, she was also the Coaches Award recipient. In her junior and senior seasons, she



was also selected to the All-Area team and earned an honorable mention spot on the All-State Team.

In the spring season, Kelly turned her attention to the lacrosse field. Here she was a 4-year starter and letter winner. She earned SOL first team honors in both 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grades. She earned All-Area honors in both 2001 and 2002, including being first team in two different publications (*Times Herald* and *Intelligencer*). In 2003 she was named team captain but unfortunately tore her ACL in the team's first game of the season. Despite missing her entire senior year, she recorded an incredible 174 career goals and 118 career assists.

Kelly was a member of the Crooked Crosse Lacrosse program. She was selected for the Philadelphia Area Girls Association's Team (PAGLA) and competed in the STX/US Lacrosse Festival in New York, to play against teams from the United States, Canada, and Australia. She also played in the Keystone State Games.

After high school, Kelly continued her athletic career at Temple University. She earned a 4-year athletic scholarship for lacrosse. She earned four varsity letters while at Temple. She was a member of the 2004 A-10 Championship Team.

Kelly is married to Jim Kelly and has two children, Ty and Maclyn. She earned her bachelor's degree from Temple in 2007. She attained her

teacher's certification from Cairn University in 2009 and her master's in Education from Gratz College in 2010. She is currently a Health and PE Teacher in the Souderton School District. Kelly coached their lacrosse program from 2013-2015 and won a league championship for the Indians. She currently coaches with Be Your Best Lacrosse and Wisslax.

#### Matt Lawson Class of 2004

Matt Lawson has had one of the more decorated cross-country and track careers at Upper Dublin. In cross country, he made an instant impact in his first season of cross country in 9<sup>th</sup> grade earning first-team all-league honors, something he accomplished in all four seasons. Matt would go on to qualify for the PIAA state championship race in his



sophomore year, the first of three appearances in that race. In his junior year, he won the SOL Freedom Division championship and also broke the UDHS XC course record. Finally, in his senior year, he won the entire Suburban One League individual championship. He also won the District I championship and earned a medal at the PIAA state championship meet. He was named as a 2<sup>nd</sup> team all-state selection and a member of the *Philadelphia Inquirer* All-Inquirer team.

In the indoor track season, Matt was a state qualifier in his sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. As a sophomore, he set the indoor 3200 meter record (9:48), and received All-American recognition in the Distance Medley Relay (DMR), which also set the school record that year with a time of 10:37. In his junior year, Matt set the school record in the 1600 meter (4:27.10). In his senior year, he set the school record in the 3000 meter (8:59.9).

In the outdoor track season, Matt continued his excellence. As a sophomore, he was a member of the DMR which set a school record and earned All-League honors. As a junior, he earned All-League in two separate events and also qualified for the PIAA state championships as a member of the 4x800 Relay. In his senior year, he earned all-league in three different events. He was the league champion in the 1600 and 3200. He set the school and league records in the 1600 that year as well. He was the District I champion in the 3200 while setting the school

record (9:30.9). Matt was also a member of the state medalist 4x800 Relay which finished 4<sup>th</sup>.

After high school, Matt continued his running career at LaSalle University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree. He is a Category Manager at Dayton Parts and has a son named Cassidy.

#### Lisa Harchut Class of 2007

The Upper Dublin girls' basketball program is thought to be one of the school's more successful programs, with Lisa Harchut atop that sports list of all-time great players. Lisa made an immediate impact on the team as a 9<sup>th</sup> grader, starting every game for the Cardinals and averaging 14.5 points per game (PPG), 5.5 rebounds (RPG), and 4 steals (SPG). She also



helped lead the team to its first district win in 20 years. In her sophomore season, she helped lead the team as a co-captain to a SOL championship and a trip to states, where they earned the school's first state win in 18 years. She averaged 19.5 PPG, 5.6 RPG, and 4 SPG for the year and almost hit the illustrious 1000-point mark, having 985 through two seasons. One of the highlights of her sophomore year came in an epic comeback over eventual state runner-up Cheltenham. Down 11 points with 2:50 left in the game, Lisa spear-headed a comeback scoring 11 straight points before finding a teammate for a game-winning basket to upset the Panthers. As a junior co-captain, she helped lead the team to a 25-7 record and a place in the Elite 8 of the PIAA state tournament. She averaged 15.7 PPG, with 4.3 RPG and 2.9 SPG and recorded her 1000<sup>th</sup> point. As a 3x co-captain her senior year, Lisa helped lead the team to a 29-2 record, a District I championship (the school's first since 1985), and a trip back to the Elite 8 of the PIAA state tournament, where they fell to eventual state champion Emmaus. Lisa also broke the school's record for most points scored in a career with 1886.

When all was said and done, Lisa averaged 15.7 PPG, finished with four team MVP awards, and was the MVP of five Tip-off/Holiday tournaments. She was named 3x to each the *Philadelphia Inquirer* All SEPA team, Montgomery Newspapers "Super 10" All-Area team, and *Street & Smith's* Honorable Mention. In 2006 Lisa was named the *Times Herald* Player of the Year. In 2007 she earned All-State 2<sup>nd</sup> team and was a McDonald's All-American Nominee.

After high school, Lisa had several Division I schools interested in her basketball talents. Ultimately, she chose to attend Harvard University, where she played basketball her freshman year. Due to a severe concussion, she was forced to resign from the team. Lisa earned her bachelor's from Harvard in 2011 and her MBA from Villanova in 2023. She enjoys reading, tennis, boxing, swimming, cycling, and hiking. She likes DIY projects and home design. Lisa is also a Crew Leader for the Friends of Wissahickon.

#### Brett Schmidt Class of 2007

If you think back to 2007, the sport of boy's lacrosse is probably one that has evolved the most in interscholastic sports. Brett Schmidt helped put boys' lacrosse at Upper Dublin on the map.



During his time at Upper Dublin, Brett was

a 3x Suburban One League All-League selection. He helped lead the team to its first-ever SOL championship. He was named the league's MVP in 2007 and was also an All-State selection.

After high school, Brett continued his playing career at the University of Maryland, where he played for four years and was a starter for three of those years. In 2010 he was named All-ACC and was on the ACC, Lax Power, and USILA All-American teams. In 2011 he was named team captain. He was again selected to the All-ACC team. He was also a USILA and LaxPower All-American. He was selected to the ACC All-Tournament team and the NCAA All-Tournament team. He was also the 2011 ACC Scholar Athlete of the Year.

After college, Brett went on to play professionally in the Major League Lacrosse, as well as the Premier Lacrosse League. In the MLL he played for the Denver Outlaws and Charlotte Hounds. He was named a 2013 and 2014 MLL All-Star. In the PLL he played for the Maryland Whipsnakes in 2019 and 2020, where his team won the PLL championship.

#### 2015 Football Team PIAA State Semi-Finalist

The 2015 Upper Dublin Football team took the community on a wild ride. The team was led by Head Coach Bret Stover. Captains for the team were Ryan Stover, Henry Winebrake, Jack Rapine and Stacey Gardner. The team finished the regular season at 10-0, which was



the first undefeated/untied team in school history. They won the Suburban One League American Conference with a 7-0 record. The team had an incredible 19 SOL American All-League representatives.

This was the last year of only four enrollment classifications in the PIAA District and State playoffs. That meant Upper Dublin had to go against some of the largest schools in the state. They entered the District I playoffs as the #3 seed. They routed Garnet Valley 35-3 in the first round. Then over the next three weeks, faced the three largest enrollment schools in District I. They defeated Upper Darby 59-34 in the quarter-finals. They then defeated Pennsbury 24-14 in the semi-finals, to set up a showdown with state power North Penn. The Cardinals won that game 46-21, capping off the school's first District I championship in school history. It was the first and only time a team with less than 700 males won the largest classification championship in football.


In the PIAA State semi-final, the Cardinals suffered their only loss to a very strong Parkland team, 30-14. That loss didn't diminish the strength and success of this team. They were ranked as high as #2 in state-wide large school rankings throughout the season. They finished with a record of 14-1,

which is the most wins in school history. They scored 40 or more points on nine occasions including the district final, in which many starters sat the entire 2<sup>nd</sup> half. They outscored opponents 616 to 146, which is the most points scored in a season in school history.

Other members of the coaching staff were Dan Pring, Eric Taylor, Rick Taylor, Ed Wall, Dan Hugenbruch, Dave Sowers, Erik Schada, Chris Naughton, Steve Roberts, Steve Young, Greg Dummeldinger, Shane Hopkins, and Paul Winters.

#### Floyd C. Dinkins, Jr Class of 1964

Floyd C. Dinkins Jr. will go down as one of the most influential and impactful individuals at Upper Dublin. He will own the rare distinction and feat of going into the Athletic Hall of Fame as both an athlete and a coach.



As an athlete, Floyd was a member of the football,

basketball, and track and field programs here at Upper Dublin from 1960-1964. On the gridiron, he was a 3-time Intercounty selection. Floyd was also an All-League selection his senior year. He also captained the team that were co-champions. On the hardwood in that same year, Floyd earned All-League honors and helped lead the basketball team to its first PIAA state tournament. On the track, he was a 3-time letter winner and he won the District I Bronze Medal in the 120 High Hurdles.

After high school, Floyd went on to Cheyney University where he continued to excel in all three sports, playing football, basketball, and track and field for four years. He graduated in 1969 with his bachelor's degree from Cheyney. He eventually earned his master's degree as well. After graduation, Floyd was hired at the Upper Dublin School District as a teacher. Immediately, he began to make an impact on the kids and community. He got into coaching right away and coached in some capacity through 2020, spanning a 50-year coaching career. Through his coaching career, he coached football as well as indoor and outdoor track and field programs at both the junior and senior high levels. Floyd was the head coach of our boys' outdoor program during their only four Suburban One League championships (1997, 1998, 2001 and 2002). He coached the 2009 Distance Medley Relay Penn Relay Champions. Finally,

he accompanied fellow UDHS Alum and Athletic Hall of Fame member Kim Gallagher to the 1984 Olympic Games.

Floyd is married to Barbara Ann Dinkins and they have two children Floyd Dinkins III (Wilma Dinkins) and Veronica Dinkins. Floyd is a member of the Omega Psi Phi, National Black Fraternity. He enjoys cooking, traveling, golfing, playing pinochle, and attending sporting events.
